COACHING:

For the past two years I've had the great opportunity as a part of my Duke of Edinburgh volunteering section to coach the school's Ull's boys and girls basketball teams. This experience has significantly improved my leadership, communication and planning skills while balancing these commitments with my wider academic obligations.

Guiding boys in the first term and girls in the second meant that I've been able to coach a diverse group which required patience, clear communication and adaptability, all of which are skills I have been able to improve and are useful as a leader and motivator.

UK National Outdoor Centre Residential Courses:

For the past three years I have attended residential summer camps for U18's, providing an amazing opportunity to meet new people with diverse backgrounds and abilities and benefit from the highly skilled outdoor instructors and wider facilities staff.

Since my first visit at 14, I have traveled alone from Lisbon to the remote center location in the heart of Snowdonia National Park in Wales. This experience alone has helped build my confidence and independence. At the center my passion for the outdoors, working within teams and testing my boundaries really kicked off through experiences like hiking up mountains with a team of teenagers with varied ages and skill levels, rock climbing on sea cliffs, navigation activities, white water rapid canoeing, ect.

My silver expedition was another great experience where we got to learn how to kayak then test our skills along the Rio Zézere. This time as we were on the water we stayed together in many groups, along the expedition.

There were many highlights of this trip; from my first wild camp on a river front to kayaking down river rapids. The best however was swimming in the river at our last campsite after setting up our tents during the sunset with our group.

Moving Country:

In 2012 my family moved from London to Lisbon, entering me into an International School for the first time, presenting me with many challenges and opportunities in relation to new surroundings, friendship groups, etc. Moving to Portugal and an International School has provided valuable insights into not only Portuguese culture, but also those of the many other international students who have now become close friends, being something I would not have experienced had I stayed in London. I now have friends from a variety of backgrounds and cultures which has widened my knowledge and perspectives.
